WORD FROM THE FOUNDING DIRECTOR

During our 13 years of existence, we have seen and shared the joy of our beneficiaries who have regained their physical mobility following a stroke or traffic accident, the joy of our children who take their first steps since birth, the joy of each person who returns to work to bring bread to their family after a major functional limitation. We also welcome the changes in attitude in favor of inclusion, resilience and community leadership.

Obviously, these were not only roses but also thorns. We have had to face great difficulties during the past years, especially in 2023, but thanks be to Almighty God, we have overcome them through the cohesion of strength of our communities, our employees, our beneficiaries and above all, the results of FONHARE's interventions which testify to the impact of the generous

contributions from its Board members, its individual donors as well as its results-oriented partnerships with Christian Blinf Mission (CBM) and Humanity & Inclusion (HI).

The most vulnerable people are more affected by this

crisis. This situation has forced institutions to close their doors and leave the country, including our long-time partner Christian Blind Mission (CBM).

Despite these hazards, FONHARE renews its commitment to people in vulnerable conditions in Haiti. It wants to be more accountable, more dynamic, more inclusive, more innovative and strategic so that, together with you and all other actors and people of good will, its much-needed services can be within the reach of the population in distress in order to perpetuate and consolidate the achievements.


Interventions & impacts

HEALTH & REHABILITATION PROGRAM


In Haiti, the need for rehabilitation services is enormous. Strokes are increasingly common, and Haiti has the highest stroke rate in the Caribbean region (GHESKIO Centers, 2018). The number of accidents on public roads has increased drastically due to the growing use of motorcycle cabs. Also during the last 5 years we have noticed an upsurge in children born with motor or psychomotor developmental delays which can be linked to the worsening food insecurity and extreme poverty fueled by the country's socio-political situation.

On the other hand, the majorities of disabled people represents the most vulnerable of the vulnerable and are unable to pay for services privately or at a price that allows self-sufficiency. FONHARE is the only organization in the Grand-Nord to offer rehabilitation services via a multidisciplinary team approach (physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and orthotics) and one of the few in the country.

Universal Accessibility Program

Despite the high number of disabilities in Haiti, urban planning practices do not take into account the accessibility of people living with disabilities. This situation reinforces their exclusion. The houses where people with disabilities live are not adapted to their handicap, which increases their dependence. The same applies to basic service infrastructures, including schools, hospitals, banks and public squares.

Beyond disability itself, the exclusion

and lack of fulfillment of people living with disabilities is due to a lack of accessibility.

As a result, FONHARE has made Universal Accessibility one of its key areas of intervention.

In 2023, here are the achievements in this area:

175 people working in the construction industry are trained in universal accessibility standards

450 young people trained in diversity, disability and inclusive practices

8 public and private administration institutions are accessible in the North and North-East.

Inclusive Humanitarian Response Program

With financial support from the international

NGO Humanité & Inclusion, FONHARE intervened in the resurgence of the Cholera epidemic in Haiti. Awareness-raising sessions were held on water, hygiene and sanitation to mitigate the spread of Cholera. And to

provide immediate responses to suspected or confirmed cholera cases in the 14 communes of the northeast.



Raising Awareness

- More than 240,000 people sensitized to water, hygiene and sanitation issues
- By community mobiles, awareness-raising agents and health cordons
- 14 North-East communes involved



Cholera Cases responded

- 484 Cholera cases assisted.
- 84.5% Cases responded within 48h



Inclusive Risk & Disaster Management Program

For greater participation and empowerment of people with disabilities at all levels in risk and disaster management, we implemented this IRDM project in the Nord and Nord-Est departments with funding from **Christian Blind Mission (CBM)**.

We created a geolocalized database of disabled people, disaggregated by sex, age and type of disability, for the communes of Ouanaminthe, Terrier-Rouge, Fort-Liberté, Limonade, Cap-Haitien and Plaine-du-Nord in the North and North-East departments.


Others impacts of the IRDM

- ✓ The set of data collection tools is inclusive (disaggregated by gender, age and type of disability).
- ✓ Each municipality in the intervention zones has an **inclusive risk and** disaster management plan.
- ✓ Municipal civil protection committees (CCPC) include at least one representative of people with disabilities.
- ✓ 208 people, including CCPC representatives, brigadiers and DPOs in the six communes, have been trained in inclusive risk and disaster management.
- ✓ 19 megaphones and 60 flags were handed over to civil protection representatives in communes in the North (Cap-Haitian, Limonade, Plaine du Nord) and North-East (Ouanaminthe, Fort-liberté, Terrier Rouge) departments, to strengthen the early warning system and make it more inclusive.
- ✓ **6 communes** in the project benefited **from inclusive multi-risk mapping** with the participation of 92 community leaders.
- ✓ **An inclusive early warning system** has been set up in the 6 communes, and 150 people have been trained in good practice.
- ✓ **150 brigadiers are trained** in the inclusive management of temporary shelters, while promoting the shelters made accessible by the project in the 6 communes.
- ✓ 8 temporary shelters have been made accessible to people with disabilities across the project's communes.



Cartographie des risques et du handicap | Limonade, Haïti












Commmune de Cap-Haïtien : Cartographie Multirisque



Child Protection and GBV Program

Children, especially girls, and women are the most at-risk segments of society. And when it comes to children, girls and women living with disabilities, their protection risks, including the risks of gender-based violence, are enormous.

In Haiti, unfortunately, children living with disabilities are generally neglected, even by their families. They are seen as having no future. And families prefer to support their other children.

FONHARE's protective intervention approach is therefore holistic.

FONHARE also welcomes national and international volunteers to support our community and beneficiaries.


FUNDING & EXPENSES


